Do not block driveway or turnaround. Proceed on foot past the gate about 0.5 mile.	2.3 mile easy/mode rate Jones Brook Trail. Best times to visit are during the fall and winter.	100-acre preserves wildlife habitat and open space for recreational uses. Jones Brook passes through the property north to south.
